

Instructions on PWAA required registration forms

Parental Form

This form is an acknowledgement of the rules and confirms that as a parent you will be on best behavior while in the presence of the participants whether it be at practice or at a Bux-Mont football game home or away.

Fill in the association with Penndel Wildcats. Fill in team with your weight class. Check the appropriate box for the sport. Fill in the child's name. Sign and date it.

Emergency Treatment Authorization Form

This form authorizes the treatment of your child by a qualified and licensed medical doctor in the even of a medical emergency. Pretty self-explanatory. Fill in all of the information. Sign and date.

Physician's Certificate

This is your child's physical form. We all understand with insurance these days that your child is usually allowed one physical per year. Your child may not be due for their physical until after the season this year. That's ok. If you child had a physical back in November 2004, just talk with your child's doctor and ask that they place a 2005 date next to their signature even if they put the "Date of Examination" as November 2004.

Membership Application

Fill in all of the family and insurance information. Do not fill in the fees; we will do that at registration. Sign and date.

Other Paperwork

There are other papers included in your packet. These are informational and for you to read and hold onto.
